DAY 01.

Arriving in Yogyakarta, will be picked up from the airport and directly transmitted to the hotel. Free times, in the afternoon, you will be picked up for dinner and watching Ramayana Ballet.

DAY 02

Breakfast in hotel, Prambanan temple , Keraton, and then visit Taman Sari (Water Castle) and see the process of making Batik Craft, and painting craft. After that, we head to Ngasem bird market and straightaway go to the historical city Kotagede which used to be the center of Mataram Empire and now it is known as the center of silver handicraft. And to UlenSentalu museum for Java art and culture museum.

DAY 03.

Breakfast in hotel, trip to the highland Dieng for visiting the Pendawa Temple complex, which is the oldest Hindu temple in Indonesia, and then heading to the Sikadang Crater and Telaga Warna. Lunch will be prepared in Wonosobo. And then we are heading to Borobudur temple to enjoy the beautiful sunset in Borobudur. After that, we have a dinner at Yogya. borobudur temple

DAY 04

Check out Hotel and drive to Bromo overnight in Bromo

DAY 05

Early morning heading to Pananjakan for sunrise by jeep and afternoon drive to Ijen for coffee plantation landscape.

DAY 06

Early morning hike to Ijen Crater for sun rise. (1,5 hours hike for 3 km) or hot bath in nearby natural hot volcanic springs and afternoon drive to Bali and finished of tour in Bali (Ubud, Denpasar, Kuta, etc) or extension program on Bali.

We strongly advise that should you wish to have a guide at some of the larger temples, please wait until you have entered the temple before negotiating with one of the registered guides within the temple itself. The average cost of a guide is approximately Rp 75,000 per hour for the most prominent temples and 1 hour is usually enough time to have a good understanding of the history of that particular temple. This does vary per temple.

Your personal possessions/belongings remain your responsibility at all times. The vehicle will always be locked when parked however this is not a guarantee that your belongings will be safe.

While this tour will not consist of strenuous activity (maximum 2km return walk up Mt Bromo), your safety is important to us so please refrain from participating in any activity that you know exceeds your fitness level. Traffic is quite chaotic in the larger cities so be careful when crossing the road, casually placing your hand out low and gently waving indicates you wish to cross and generally the traffic obliges and will go around you.

Please note that Mt Bromo/Panjakan is quite cold especially close to the rainy season (January – April) especially early in the morning for the sunset. Please come equipped with rain jackets, beanies and gloves (all can be purchased on site) but worth bringing your own particularly if you feel the cold. Once the sun has rise, it warms up pretty quickly.
